

Spiritually Speaking



He reached and rescued me *by Robert Soto, Lipan Apache* 

I first noticed a small conflict between Native and non-Native when I was in first grade. It was at that age that I discovered that a lot of people did not appreciate me being American Indian. I remember children in first grade asking me if I was Mexican and I would say, "No, I am Apache." That was in 1960. So each time I would tell my friends I was Apache, they would tell their parents that they had met an Apache boy. The parents would say, "You have to talk to your grandparents. They remember stories about Apaches." Then the grandparents would tell them of the time they were children and about the Lipan Apache wars between the Texans, Mexicans and Apaches and they would warn their grandchildren to be careful with the Apaches who raided, killed and scalped. Then the grandchildren would come to school and have nothing to do with me because I was Apache.

I wish it would stop there but it only got worse for as I got older, I discovered that the attacks only intensified. Attacks got verbal but with time the things I heard started hatred and distrust in my heart; not just against non-Natives but Natives themselves who sometimes were no different than the whites and Mexicans I lived with. Then I became a Christian and discovered that a lot of Christians were no better than the non-Christian community. I guess if I had any salvation it had to come from my relationship with God the Creator. I discovered that if anyone was going to help me it was going to be God. It is as David stated: "He reached down from on high and took hold of me; he drew me out of deep waters. He rescued me from my powerful enemy, from my foes, who were too strong for me." I wish I could say that everything has been well with my soul, but it has not. But I have discovered that with God the Creator taking care of me, things have been a lot different.

The color of the East direction is yellow. The first rays of morning sun bring the new light of innocence. East is the white plumage of the eagle feather. It is the filling of the night container. It is an infant. It is the conception of a new day. It is the spring of the year stimulation new growth. It is the creation of life. This is East direction.

The color of the South direction is red, the color of Earth Mother. South represents summer and adolescence. It is hormones exploding, experimentation, and invigorating growth spurts. Peer conformity replaces parental dominance. It is a time for confusion, the precedence of wisdom. It is a time to collect one's identity, and the time of the vision quest. This is the South direction.

The color of the West direction is black. The sun trail takes us into the cavern of Self. We come to see Self in the deep, still waters within. The mirror of the Bear reflects our essence. This is the autumn of our life, our adult years. It is a time to bundle our knowledge into wisdom. It is time for us to empty our bucket, so that we become filled. This is to become mature. This is the West direction.


The color of the North direction is white. It is a time for enlightenment, a time to be purified and refined. It is time to wear the white crown of Elder enlightenment. From this spiritually dominant position flows the eternal waters of life, the wellspring of the life cycle. The North contains shifting spiritual ice sheets that move from great pressure. A new spiritual construct results. A Grand Canyon of Self emerges. Darkness accents the light. From the North all will be renewed. This is the North direction.

Beyond the Four Directions, we find the fifth direction of Earth Mother. The green color reminds us that growth is needed. Earth Mother supplies nourishment. Earth Mother is our connection to life.

The Sixth Direction is Sky Father, depicted with the color blue. It reminds us to monitor our life choices. It is here where evaluation will take place. It is the connection to the world from which we came and to where we will go.

The Seventh Direction is you. You are part of the hoop of life that intersects Eternity. This is the direction to come to Self, to recognize your role in life, to give of your Self.

Directions to: Tiverton Rod & Gun Club

From Fall River, Providence, and points north, take Route 195 east to Route 24S. Follow 24S to Fish Rd exit in Tiverton. Take left off the ramp and follow Fish Rd approx. 2 miles past the Tiverton Police station. Tiverton Rod & Gun Club is on your right. If you see Bulgarmarsh RD, you passed it.

From southern RI, take the Jamestown and Newport bridges and continue through Middletown & Portsmouth on Route 114 (West Main Road) to Route 24N. Once across the Sakonnet River Bridge, take Fish Rd exit. Bear to right at Police station and follow approx. 2 miles.

# Iroquois Soup





Ingredients:

- 1 lb fish
  2 qts water
  2 tablespoons cornmeal
  1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups dried lima beans (\*cheat: 1 10-15oz can)
  1 teaspoon parsley
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lb sliced mushrooms 4 packages beef boullion 1 large onion, chopped 1 clove garlic, minced 1-2 tablespoons butter
- Extra seasonings to taste: dash of basil, black pepper and salt

# Instructions:

\*\*<u>Soak lima beans overnight</u> - or cheat & use canned.

Sauté minced garlic, onion and fish in butter, stirring frequently to break fish into pieces (approx. 5 minutes).

Then add water, boullion, mushrooms, parsley, basil, pepper, cornmeal, salt and drained lima beans.

Cook until beans are soft (approx. 30-40 minutes).

Serves 4 - 6



Inspirational:

White covers much of the earth during winter's harsh, cold months, representing the nourishing blanket that secures all of nature while it lies sleeping. Winter also represents elders and their final walks along the Red Road. Our grandparents are wise and the winter is silent. Therefore, the time of the North is a special time for storytelling. In olden times, children and adults would gather around a fire and hear the storyteller narrate legends and myths of their people. Storytellers orally teach the traditions of their people and keep alive the history of their tribe. The Chippewa called North "Waboose", which is depicted as a strong, powerful buffalo withstanding the effect of winter.

#### From 3 Horses:

Like the message in "Spiritually Speaking" and in the "Inspiration"; We must be like the Buffalo in winter, strong and able to withstand the winter cold, be able to fight off the "Evil one" when he tries to lead you or scare you away from following the Red Road. We must be able to walk our path, even though it may be littered with obstacles, debris or other stumbling blocks. We must focus on what is right & good. We must work together as a family. We must tell our stories to others. We must love one another. We must trust one another. When in doubt, sing the song "Oh oh Heyoko" to yourself. Think about the harmony in that song, think about the words, "Listen to your heart now, listen to what it says", "Take care of your body, take care of your mind", "Love everything that you do now, love everything you do", "Take care of each other, love them with all your heart".
