On Dec 3rd we held a Naming Ceremony at Rick and Wolf Spirit See's house for their nephew Aiden. It was a brisk morning which warmed up and turned out to be a beautiful day. Aiden's parents attended the ceremony and all were delighted with the name that Creator chose for him - Little Bear Paw. A great pot-luck followed.

Also on Dec 3rd, we drummed at the Dighton Council's pot-luck dinner and dance social. Aiden sat in at the drum with us. As always there was a big turn out and a lot of fun. Our rendition of "Stuck in the smoke hole of our tee-pee" was well received.

At December's meeting, an application was read and voted upon, for Aiden Little Bear Paw to become our newest family member.

Also at the Dec meeting, we had our St Joseph's Christmas gift gathering and pot luck Christmas party, as well as our first Nikomo. There was a lot of great gifts for both, St Joes, and ourselves, and great food.

Originally there were 4 big boxes of gifts sent to St Joes, from our gift gathering on the 3rd. More donations were brought by after the original 4 boxes were shipped. Days later, we were contacted by Theresa, from the Middletown Library, who told us that the East Bay Community Action Program were at the library and were distributing toys to needy families or organizations, and that she had placed our name on their list. Barbara & Hollie attended the event. After telling the people about St Joseph's and what they do for the reservation children, they loaded us down with tons of Hasbro toys. After they were all packaged up, there were another 6 big boxes of gifts for St Joes, 10 in all. Creator, if You speak to me through dreams, let me know it in terms I can understand.


